Law Enforcement Encounters: Know Your Rights





- If you are stopped, do not run and do not provide false information.
- If you are asked questions, say "I want to remain silent and speak with a lawyer."
- Do not answer questions about your **immigration status** or otherwise reveal your immigration status.

IN YOUR HOME



- If ICE agents come to your home, do not open the door.
- Ask to see a judicial warrant. Ask ICE to slip it under the door or window.
- If they do not have a warrant, do not answer their questions.
 Say "I do not consent to your entry."
- If they have a warrant, check that it is **signed by a judge**. If it is not, do not consent to entry or answer questions.
- If they have a warrant signed by a judge, ICE agents can only search the place named in the warrant or detain the person named in the warrant.
- If there is a person named in the judicial warrant, send **only** that person out of the home to be detained. Do not answer questions about persons not named in the warrant.
- **Do not sign** anything that ICE gives you, without first talking to an attorney.
